NEW GUIDANCE FOR WORSHIP SERVICES FROM THE BISHOP'S OFFICE

- 1. Anyone attending Mass or visiting the parish office must carry out and pass a health check: <u>BC COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool</u>. Anyone not feeling well should stay home.
- 2. Masks are mandatory for all people 12 years and older for indoor gatherings. Please ensure your mask covers both your nose and mouth.
- 3. Physical distancing: 2 meters for all those not of the same household. Because of this, there will be two Masses on Sundays and the need to register online (not for contact tracing) but because the Church cannot accommodate all in one Mass schedule.
- 4. Hand Sanitizers: readily available and to be used by all those entering church premises.
- 5. Holy Communion will continue under one species, the Body of Christ.
- 6. Pastoral Visitors and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion: you will be required to provide proof of vaccination to enter long term care homes, private hospitals, extended care hospitals, and assisted living residences according to the recent Public Health Order of 20 August 2021.
- 7. Communion at the parking lot will continue for those who are not able to attend indoor mass provided they have attended a virtual Mass. (AFTER 10:30 AM MASS)
- 8. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in person still remains in place. Nonetheless, everyone is encouraged to return to in-person celebrations of the Eucharist.
- 9. No gathering in the foyer before and after the celebration.
- 10. The parish office open remains open to the public. Social distancing, hand sanitizing, mask protocol to be maintained.
- 11. Weddings and funerals: up to 50 people; masks are mandatory for those 12 years of age and older with a covid-19 safety plan.
- 12. Discretionary or social or non-essential meetings will be subject to proof of vaccination requirements starting September 13, 2021 (1st dose) with full implementation by October 24, 2021 (2nd dose).
- 13. Non-discretionary meetings such as AA, NA or other support groups are exempt from the proof of vaccination requirements.
- 14. Everyone eligible is encouraged to be vaccinated as vaccinations are the surest way of protecting oneself and especially others.

LIFE ISSUES: THE INDIGENOUS PERSPECTIVE



Summary Reporting to the Pastor or his designate, the Custodian maintains the church and Parish centre and associated grounds. Basic Position Description: To clean and maintain the Parish buildings and grounds. Duties and Responsibilities • Clean washrooms, dust all surfaces, clean glass windows and surfaces, dry mop or vacuum all floors and remove garbage and recycle items from Parish buildings. • Ensure that the sacristy and church (e.g., pews, floors) are clean at all times. • Maintain the carpets and hard-surfaced floors periodically. • Perform and/or report necessary repairs. • Keep all equipment in good working order. • Coordinate periodic fire inspections. • Maintain the grounds, lawns and flowerbeds as required. • Clear snow and ice from sidewalks and walkways and maintain the spring, autumn and winter checklists required by the diocesan insurance policy. • Arrange for power sweeping of parking lots and line painting if required. • Maintain the cleaning supplies inventory and order supplies as needed within the approved budget. • Update and maintain records contained within the diocesan "Arson Risk Management Compliance Declaration." • Provide other duties as required.
