PASTOR'S MESSAGE

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 6, 2024

"Marriages are made in Heaven" is an expression with excitement & challenge. Today's Scriptures from Genesis 2:7,15, 18-24 & Mark 10:2-16 explore the possibilities of a pleasant married life for couples. The 'would-be' couples get excited for their lifelong union and commitment. This excitement about the special union & a new relationship blossoms in their heart and continues for quite some time until they face challenges. Soon they begin to understand that it is not the bed of roses...but it has its thorns too. The main concept of married state comes from Genesis 2:7, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will give him a helper as his partner". God formed the woman from the rib of the man and gave it to the man, who looked at her and said, "This at last is the bone of my bone and flesh of my flesh. This one shall be called woman" (Ge 2:21). Man and woman complement each other by building mutual trust and confidence in each other.

Today's Catholic world has a little more than 2 billion people. (But Christianity is the single largest faith-based community having a population of 3.7 billion people). In 1970 there were 3.725 million Catholic marriages (Catholic + Catholic). In 2015 this statistic dropped to 2.486 million Catholic marriages. Today in 2024, it has become slimmer...there's a sharp decline in Catholic marriages. The total divorce rate in Western European is about 30%. Belgium records 70% UK & North America is 50%. Portugal records 60% making the divorce rate very high in the modern world. Christopher West in his book, 'The Theology of the Body' based on the teachings of Pope John Paul II, explained that 'Marriage as an authentic expression of God's Love'. Marriage relationship is authentic when it is motivated by love, which is genuine and lasting longer, otherwise, it is an artificial love or arbitrary relationship. 'Authentic love leads to the sanctity of marriage & artificial love leads to gratification of one's desires, called lust'.

Globe & Mail in 2012 wrote an article with the title, 'The Changing Nature of Family Dynamics in Canada'. It explained that the Canadian families are complex in nature and reality, giving the various forms of unions such as 'Common law families, single parent households, step father & step mother families, same sex couples, etc.; along with multigenerational families, foster children families and sandwich generation families'. Globe & Mail concluded, our family models are both exciting and challenging. Exciting because of its variety, challenging because of its instability. Due to this ongoing situation, Canadian birth rate is decreasing in stable families and births outside of marriages are on the increase. (This is the reality in the industrial world). Single parent households are on the rise. It's a conscious choice among young adults, because it gives independence for educational and occupational reasons and endeavours.

Marriage becomes a challenge when it is contracted for 'social convenience', says Pope Francis. Special considerations like wealth, property, prestige, status, etc. impede the real purpose of marriage. When love falls short, everything dwindles & crumples. When expectations are not realized or satisfied, conflicts arise and ultimately lead to broken relationships ending the marriage relationship. This modern reality is very troubling & disturbing and it has affected the Church very much....'very many have left the church', because the Church seems to be too hard on people in the practice of their marital vocation. Therefore, Pope Francis had come out with the 'Family Synod' to help out those who face these challenges. According to him, 'the church should radiate the goodness of God and the deep mercy of Him'. He has fondly advised all those who are responsible to dispense the Mercy of God with the mindset of Christ.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 13, 2024


'Wisdom is the fashioner of all things.' This week's Scriptures capture this concept of 'pursuit of wisdom'. The Book of Wisdom 1:7 glorifies in "The awe-inspiring presence of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom". Wisdom is a treasure which blesses people with fame, name and glory. Wisdom is the grace of God. The ancients equated wisdom with success in life, arts, politics and whatever activity they engaged in. Wisdom was the dream gift of King Solomon. God blessed him to be a good king, administrator, builder, trader and a sage (1Kgs 3:5-15). He was successful in everything and great world personalities visited with him, like Queen Sheba. The Book of Prophet Micah 6:8 codifies the following requirements to attain wisdom: 1. To love the Lord 2. To execute justice & 3. To walk humbly before the Lord. But the world considers status, gold, prestige, power, wealth & privileges as the means to gain this treasure called wisdom.

The framer of the American Constitution, Benjamin Franklin, was of the opinion that, 'if wealth is lost, nothing is lost, if health is lost, something is lost, but if character is lost, everything is lost.' Therefore, he admonished the Americans to build their character, which should be the hallmark of American Wisdom. The ancients believed in 'common sense' and considered it as wisdom...especially, honoring the deity, widows, helping the orphans, destitutes, aliens and doing good works for the vulnerable people. The Bible always recommends to treat everyone with dignity, honor, equity and never to hurt anyone. The Psalm 90 tells us that 'our human life is very brief' (maybe 80 / 90 years). It's a good idea to seek the intervention of God at each step of our way, for guidance and direction. God has prescribed each of us a specific time to be born and to vacate from this earth. During this brief existence we should strive to obtain wisdom to gain the favor of the Almighty.

The Hebrews identified 'Torah' as 'Divine Wisdom' (the five books of Moses). Psalm 34 invites us to 'Taste the Lord & Seek the Lord'...turning to him in our desperate need, listening to him in humility of heart & spirit and loving him with our steadfastness. Pope John Paul II was of the opinion that 'We need to soak in His Presence' (Wis 8:1). The word of God helps us make a difference. It achieves its purpose because it penetrates into the deepest roots of our life / being (between soul & spirit, bone & marrow). It knows the intention of our heart. Lk 6:45 "Out of the abundance of the heart that the mouth speaks".

Therefore, today's scriptures orient us not to develop 'spiritual complacency' with our prosperity (material wealth) as it leads to self reliance and inconsiderate / arrogant activities. Rather than this, we are invited to depend on the Providence of God. The scriptures encourage us: "In prosperity let us be grateful. In adversity, let us be thankful". Wealth and power generate false security to humans. But in order to gain 'Eternal life' we need to imbibe the attitude of gratitude and the capacity to share what we have with others. Eternal Life is a blessing / favor from the Almighty. It should flow from our 'right living'. Let us remember that the Kingdom of God is not food and drink, but it is 'Peace & Joy in the Holy Spirit' (Gal 5:22-23). Let's seek this Wisdom in today's liturgy.


